It's Not Your Parent's Resume!

A lively session presenting:

- What's a "Resoome" and why do I need one anyway – Understand what a resume actually is and what it can do for you.
- Just the facts "M'am" – Discover the 3 types of resumes and the one which is best for new technical graduates.
- I didn't know that - Resume myths exposed and explained.
- Do I print or click – Digital or paper resumes.
- Now that I've written it, what do I do with it – Resume production and distribution techniques and strategies.

Interviewing for Techies – You mean I have to talk too?

A lively interactive session presenting:

- How do I get one of these things anyway? - a brief review of use of resume and job search tips.
- If you want to be a duck (engineer or architect), you have to walk like a duck, talk like a duck and look like a duck! - Covers non-verbal communication, verbal communication, and professional dress.
- Now that I've landed an interview, what do I do with it? – covers the 3 major phases of the interview, what to do in each and how to identify the transition points.
- Ok I did it, what next? – follow up tips to close the sale.
